## SOS Toulouse Oliver Announces 2018 Primary Election Voter Turnout

SANTA FE – New Mexico Secretary of State Maggie Toulouse Oliver today announced the number of New Mexicans who have voted in the 2018 Primary Election. Secretary Toulouse Oliver will release updated early and absentee voter turnout numbers every Saturday through Election Day.

"As part of my continued push for greater transparency in government, I'm making the voter turnout data publicly available for all New Mexicans," said Secretary Toulouse Oliver. "I urge New Mexico's voters to take advantage of their right to mark a ballot whether they choose to vote absentee, early or on Election Day."

Under state law, voters must be registered to vote with one of the state's three major political parties – Democratic, Libertarian or Republican – to vote in the June Primary Election.

On May 8, county clerks began sending absentee ballots to voters who had successfully completed the absentee ballot application process. County clerks will continue mailing absentee ballots to voters until June 1. Also on May 8, in-person voting opened at the office of all 33 county clerks. Early voting will continue every Monday through Saturday until June 2. Election Day is June 5. Voters can visit <a href="MVVote.org">NMVote.org</a> to check their voter registration status, find a voting location and its hours of operation, request an absentee ballot, download a sample ballot and more.

The table below provides the number of absentee and in-person ballots cast between May 8 and yesterday, May 18. The next report on statewide voter turnout will be released on Saturday, May 26, and will include early voting ballots cast through the close of voting locations on Friday, May 25.
