SOS Toulouse Oliver Announces Updated 2018 Primary Election Voter Turnout

SANTA FE – New Mexico Secretary of State Maggie Toulouse Oliver today provided an update on the number of New Mexicans who have voted in the 2018 Primary Election. Secretary Toulouse Oliver will continue to release updated early and absentee voter turnout numbers every Saturday through Election Day.

"We've seen robust voter participation so far in the Primary Election and I'm confident that trend will continue," said Secretary Toulouse Oliver. "If you haven't voted already, request an absentee ballot or find an early voting location as soon as possible by going to NMVote.org."

Voters can also visit <u>NMVote.org</u> to check their voter registration status, download a sample ballot, view important election dates and more.

On May 8, county clerks began sending absentee ballots to voters who had successfully completed the absentee ballot application process. County clerks will continue mailing absentee ballots to voters until June 1. Also on May 8, in-person voting opened at the office of all 33 county clerks. Expanded early voting began last Saturday, May 19, and will continue every Monday through Saturday until June 2. Election Day is June 5.

Under state law, voters must be registered to vote with one of the state's three major political parties – Democratic, Libertarian or Republican – to vote in the June Primary Election.

The table below provides the number of absentee and early ballots cast between May 8 and yesterday, May 25. The next report on statewide voter turnout will be released on Saturday, June 2, and will include absentee and early voting ballots cast through the close of voting locations on Friday, June 1.
