SOS Toulouse Oliver Announces Unofficial 2018 Primary Election Voter Turnout

SANTA FE – Secretary of State Maggie Toulouse Oliver today announced unofficial overall voter turnout in the 2018 Primary Election. The Primary Election voter turnout data and election results are considered unofficial until the State Canvassing Board has certified the election results on Tuesday, June 26, 2018. This year’s unofficial Primary turnout results indicate a 29 percent increase over the official 2014 Primary Election turnout figures.

“Our democracy is at its strongest when voters participate, which is why I was glad to see a meaningful increase in the number of ballots cast this year as opposed to last midterm election in 2014,” said Secretary Toulouse Oliver. Secretary Toulouse Oliver continued, “I thank my staff, every New Mexico county clerk and the countless poll officials who worked together to make sure Election Day ran smoothly.”

The Primary Election voter turnout data and election results are considered unofficial until the County Canvassing Board in each county and the State Canvassing Board – which by state law consists of the Secretary of State, the Governor, and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court – have certified the election results. The State Canvassing Board will meet to certify the 2018 Primary Election results on Tuesday, June 26, at which point the results will become official. Until that time, the voter turnout data will fluctuate as the canvass proceeds.

Under state law, only voters who are registered with one of the state’s three major political parties – Democratic, Libertarian or Republican – were eligible to vote in the June Primary Election.
